

From the Director

Our first full year of operation following the completion of the last construction project saw the successful resumption of programs and services.


Visits to the library showed the greatest increase over past years. Library use goes far beyond checking out books. Today's patrons make extensive use of workstations accessing the Internet, information databases and office applications. New spaces such as the Quiet Study, Group Study and Assisted Study rooms have had steady use as well. Our website had as many visitors throughout the year as we had walk-in visits for a daily average of 550 per day in both venues.

Interlibrary loan materials are a significant part of what we circulated. This popular service has been enhanced by patrons being able to place their own requests for materials in our shared online catalog and through Michigan Library Exchange (MiLE). MiLE includes the book collections academic and special libraries as well as public libraries outside of our shared system.


Attendance at Children's programs has returned to pre-construction levels. In addition to traditional story times and craft programs we have begun screenings of feature films, both contemporary and classic titles. A broader range of programs for adults and young adults has been on offer as well. These have included introductory computer classes, lectures, and special interest topics such as Duct Tape Craft for Teens (who knew it comes in so many colors). In a joint effort with the Waterford Cultural Council, we presented "An Evening With Thomas Lynch." The Michigan author and poet shared his experiences as a writer and readings from his most recent book.

It has been an exciting year.


Library Visits 2001 - 2005
